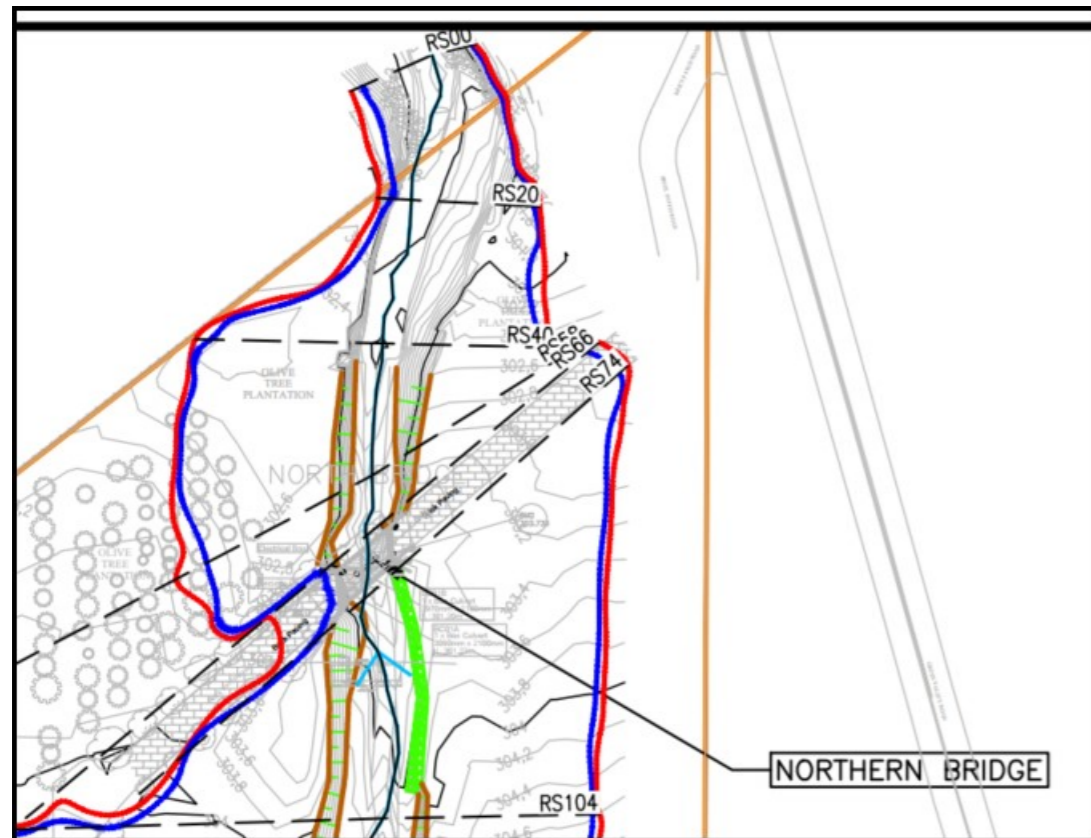
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Hi Jammie,

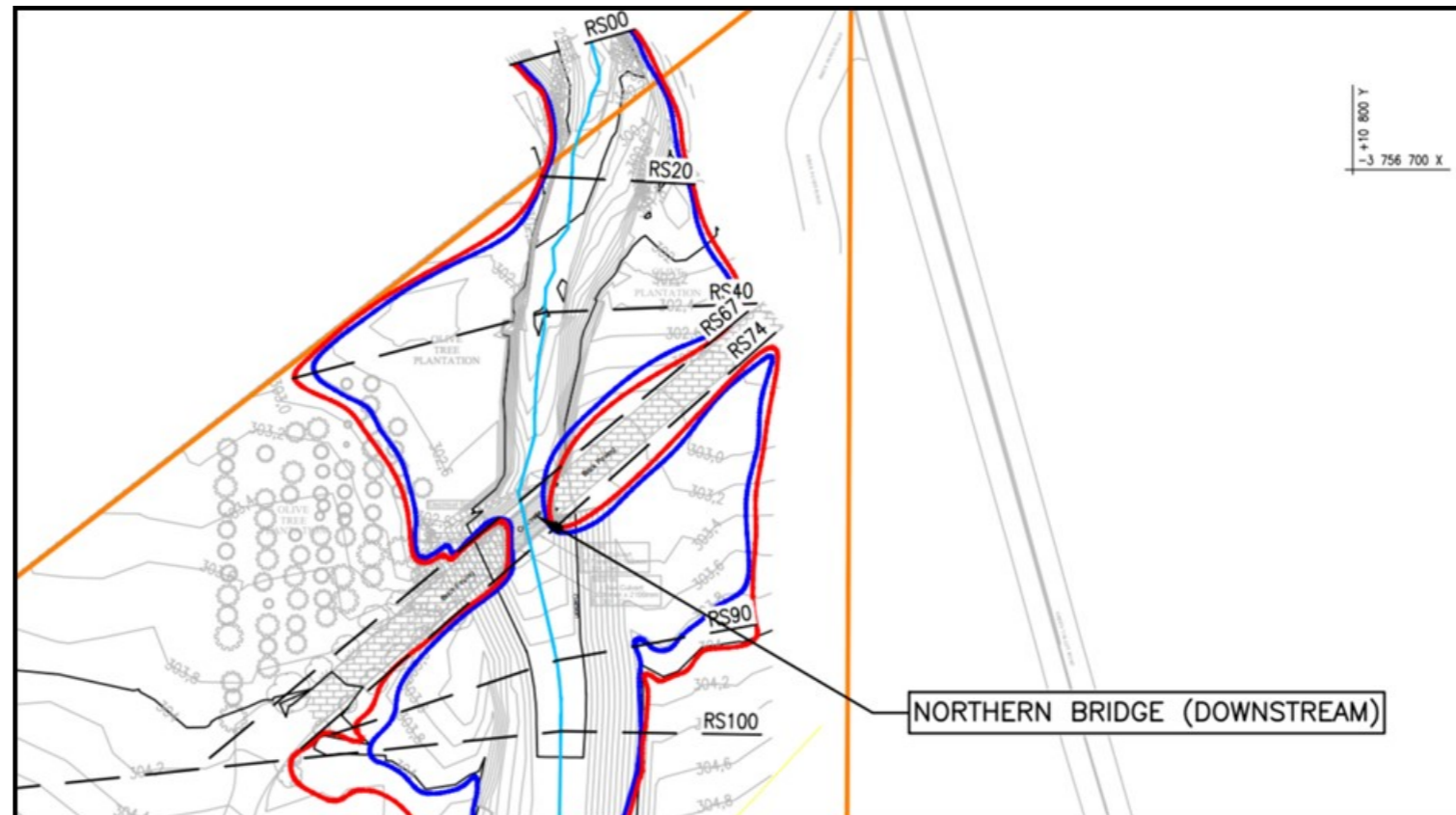
We refer to our telephonic conversation earlier today related to your meeting with the Dept of Env Affairs and their query related to the impact that the works would have downstream of Riverstone.

Based on our calculations the floodlines before and after the remediation are very similar, thus indicating that there is no anticipated change to the flows downstream of the remedial works in terms of flow. Over time there would however be a positive impact in so far that there should be less transportation of silt / rock downstream of the site after the remedial works have been completed and revegetated.

If you can please assist with your anticipated timelines related to the Environmental Approval as we are needing to start with planning related to the implementation of the project and in particular the landscaping / sourcing of plants?
